Chief Woodley reported the previous BID for SCBA’s and Turnout Gear does not meet the FEMA requirements so we will have to develop a new bid for the AFG Grant. We can still utilize a national purchasing agreement for the extrication equipment. No acceptance or denial on the fire truck portion of the grant as of Friday, September 3, 2021. A new bid will need to be written to meet all the requirements. The FEMA regulations are completely different from the State requirements and the documents to prepare it contains 460 pages for review. Mayor Riggins suggested Bill Justice, Attorney to prepare this FEMA bid. The equipment must be in place by Sept 2, 2023. Mayor Riggins agrees that we need to spend more money for the fire department to get free grant money.

Mayor Riggins thanked the Westover Fire Dept for removing the Flags from the flagpoles.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Update - Mt Tabor Annex – Mayor Riggins reported the asphalt paving will begin tomorrow. Mt. Tabor Annex has a new Front Door/key, Panic Bar, Handicap Ramp, two ADA Compliant entrances and a ADA bathroom.

Update - Fire Department Construction Project Status – Mayor Riggins reported that Contractor is waiting to install the ceiling grid until Sprinkler System is installed. Dry wall has been done and prepping now to get ready to paint. The ceiling lights are installed. A drainage ditch needs to be done. Still have a lot of concrete to be poured on the driveway and parking in the rear.

Mayor Riggins asked Chief Woodley if he received a response back from the Shelby County Engineer regarding the water. Chief Woodley does not know who the Sprinkler Company is but Walter Bradford, Building Inspector would know.

Mayor Riggins stated the sprinkler system will not work because the water lines on Highway 280 are too small causing low pressure and a flow problem. These water lines will need to be upgraded in order to pass inspection of the Sprinkler System. There is an estimated timeframe of 16 to 18 months from the Shelby County Water system.

Mayor Riggins replied extension of sewer, broadband, funding for COVID expense and bonuses to our first responders up to \$25,000.00 per year. **WESTOVER CITY COUNCIL  
MINUTES  
September 21, 2021**

The meeting of the Council of the City of Westover, Alabama was held in the City Hall in Westover, Alabama at 6:30 p.m. on September 21, 2021.

**Call To Order**

Mayor Riggins called the meeting to order.

**Roll Call** – Clerk Meacham

Upon roll call, the Mayor declared a quorum present and the regular session opened for transaction of business.

**In Attendance:** Mayor Riggins, Councilmembers: Annette Tyler, Roberta Stamp, Wayne Jones, Susan Lane & Dr. Jay Crisman

**Absent:** None

**Invocation:** The invocation was given by Ed Stowell, Planning Commission Chair.

**Pledge of Allegiance:** The Pledge was led by Mayor Riggins.

**COMMUNICATIONS**

Mayor Riggins read the Council meeting rules Section 8 concerning speakers. Mayor Riggins stated the rule of advance notice to speak at a City Council will not apply to tonight's public hearing.

Mayor Riggins stated there will be a Public Hearing tonight to consider re-zoning the parcel situated in the vicinity of the Northwest corner of US Hwy. 280 and County Highway 51. Parcel #08 9 29 0 001 033.000. Jay Sawyer, Brasher Holdings, LLC, is representing Cecile Erwin and Inez Smith for this re-zoning petition. This was presented to the Planning Commission during the months of July and August 2021 and the Planning Commission has sent their recommendation to rezone to the Council.

**OPEN PUBLIC HEARING**

The opening statement was made by Jeremy Taylor, EMTR Engineer. Mr. Taylor reported that he had begun meetings with the City to present the proposed Housing layout and zoning. The first layout was approximately 180 lots. After the first conference call with Mayor Riggins and Jerry South, City Engineer, they reduced the number of lots to 160 in July 2021. Further meetings and discussion with Mayor Riggins and Jerry South, City Engineer, the number of lots was reduced again to 120 lots. During that time complete traffic study was done. The Traffic Study recommends a left turning lane and a larger than normal right turn radius at Hwy. 51. The recommended improvements have been sent to the County for their review. The County is in the process of reviewing at this time. There are three detention ponds shown on the project. These ponds have been located to manage storm flow. These ponds will be designed and reviewed by the City Engineer, Shelby County Engineer and Alabama Department of Environmental Management for approval.

Mayor Riggins stated this rezoning request had been advertised in July, August and September 2021. Public hearing signs were displayed and certified letters were sent to the adjoining land owners. Some citizens called and spoke with Mayor Riggins and Juno Manning, Planning & Zoning Clerk.

Mayor Riggins asked for a motion to open the public hearing.

A motion was made by Councilmember Susan Lane to open the public hearing.

A second was made by Councilmember Annette Tyler.

The motion to open public hearing was approved unanimously.

Mayor Riggins called for speakers that were in opposition of this rezoning.

The first speaker, Paula Floyd resides at 5555 Old Highway 280, Westover, Alabama. Mrs. Floyd spoke in opposition of this rezoning petition.

Mrs. Floyd stated that she has concerns about the rezoning change because she believes that the original intent of the people that were involved in the incorporation of the City of Westover wanted to keep Westover a low-density residential community. It is clear to her that the majority of the neighbors nearest to this land are not in favor of this zoning change. If the zoning changes and this land is used for a multi-dwelling residential community, it would not fit the future plan. Primary access to this area is extremely close to the major intersection of US 280 and County Rd 51.

This intersection already is congested at times with Westover residents accessing the US 280 corridor. It seems to her that adding more vehicular traffic from a dense residential community would not be in the best interest of the City of Westover. She believes that the question of what is the best use of the land cannot be decided by the City Council, but, by Engineers, Land Planners and Environmental Management Specialists. She believes, if the City council makes a decision to change the zoning from AP to RN, on this property in question, they will be setting a precedent for future land zoning requests. It is her belief, that this change is not in the best interest of Westover at this time.

No others spoke in opposition.

Mayor then opened the floor for those in favor to speak.

Jay Sawyer, Brasher Holdings, spoke in favor and is representing the developer. He stated the intent of the development is to be in conformity to regulations.

The next speaker, Barbara McCullers, 220 Highway 101, Sterrett, Al 35147 commented she was not necessarily against the rezoning but was opposed to use of Hwy. 101 as an emergency exit due to the width of the street.

No others coming forward, Mayor Riggins requested a motion to close the public hearing.

A motion was made by Councilmember Roberta Stamp to close the public hearing.

A second was made by Councilmember Susan Lane.

Motion to close the public hearing was approved unanimously.

Mayor asked Jeremy Taylor if any more information is available regarding this project. Mr. Taylor stated, that concerning the traffic and intersection, they had hired a Traffic Engineer Consultant and a traffic study has been done. Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) will have to approve the designs. ALDOT will have to approve the plans as well as sewer, which will bring value to commercial property along Hwy 51.

Councilmember Wayne Jones asked Mr. Taylor about the reports he will be receiving from ALDOT and Shelby County and would Mayor Riggins and City Council receive a copy of these reports? Mr. Taylor replied yes, he would send copies to Mayor Riggins.

Wayne Jones, Councilmember, asked how long the traffic study will be in force and if there would be a change in traffic flow? Mr. Taylor replied they are doing forecasting for three to five years.

Dr Crisman, Councilmember, asked if the sewer system is with Enviro-systems, Stan Graves. Mr. Taylor replied yes, Stan Graves, Enviro-systems.

Councilmember Dr. Crisman asked if there are any plans for broadband, fiber optic cable with this development. Mr. Taylor replied they have none at this time, but if fiber optic cable is provided close enough, they will extend into the subdivision.

Mayor Riggins stated this project came in as a proposed subdivision and he thinks that he, along with the Planning Commissioners and the City Engineer were quick to point out to them that the first actual 208 lots presented was too much density. The Planning Commission by law is to establish, first of all, what a future land use should be.

Councilmember Roberta Stamp stated the question was, what is the best use of this land and changing to Residential Neighbor will match up with the land surrounding it, which is Residential Neighborhood.

Mayor Riggins stated an Ordinance will be presented for approval later in this meeting.
